County Notes

This part of the football season is always full of events from the County Association's point of view, and it has become more hectic due to the success of the County XI.

Today we have four of the most attractive sides in the County participating in the Easter Monday finals. Truro City have an excellent record behind them this season, and we must assume that they start as favourites for the cup. Favourites, however, are often upset, and Penzance will have gained in confidence from their success over St. Blazey in the semi-final when the latter club was probably expected to win.

The runners-up game between Newquay and St. Blazey will recall memories of past finals and it should be a very good game.

Truro's last success in the Senior Cup was in 1959, and that of Penzance in 1948.

The somewhat unexpected success of the County XI against Sussex in the Southern Counties' Amateur Championship has necessitated some previous arrangements having to be changed. The date for the semi-final against Huntingdonshire has been fixed for April 8th, and the game will be at Truro. Unfortunately the date clashed with the Junior Cup Finals which were to be played at Newquay. They have now been changed to April 15th, and will be at St. Austell. The finalists are Lerryn and Gerrans, and the runners-up between Camelford British Railways and St. Keverne.

At the time of writing this programme there are five teams still left in the Charity Cup Competition. They are Helston, St. Blazey, Newquay, and St. Just or Wadebridge. The draw has not yet been made.
